

CHC43015 CERTIFICATE IV IN AGEING SUPPORT

HIGHER LEVEL SKILLS

Get a head start on your career in the aged and community care sector with this mid-level qualification and gain the skills and knowledge needed to work as an aged care worker.

COURSE INFORMATION

This qualification* reflects the role of support workers who complete specialised tasks and functions in aged services; either in residential, home or community based environments. Workers will take responsibility for their own outputs within defined organisation guidelines and maintain quality service delivery through the development, facilitation and review of individualised service planning and delivery.

Workers may be required to demonstrate leadership and have limited responsibility for the organisation and the quantity and quality of outputs of others within limited parameters.

To achieve this qualification, the candidate must have completed at least 120 hours of work as detailed in the Assessment Requirements of the units of competency.

OUTCOMES

Possible job outcomes include:

- Disability Support Worker
- Coordinator of Volunteers (for services for older people)
- Care Service Team Leader
- Aged Care Activity Worker

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE TRAINING?

To be eligible for the Higher Level Skills program, individuals must meet the following criteria:

- Be aged 15 years or over;
- Be no longer at school;
- Permanently reside in Queensland;
- Be an Australian citizen, Australian permanent resident (includes humanitarian entrant), temporary resident with the necessary visa and work permits on the pathway to permanent residency, or a New Zealand citizen;
- Not hold, and not be enrolled in, a certificate IV or higher-level qualification, not including qualifications completed at school and foundation skills training; and
- Student must already hold the CHC33015 Certificate III in Individual Support (or superseded qualification)
- Be an existing worker in the aged care industry sector.

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STUDENT CO-CONTRIBUTION FEES

Given the benefits that accrue to individuals from training, students undertaking certificate III training and non-concessional students undertaking lower level training, will be required to contribute to the costs of their training through a co-contribution fee. The fee may be paid on behalf of the student by the employer or a third party unrelated to the PQS but cannot be paid or waived by the PQS.
